# FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

We've certainly had a busy start to the term with lots of events either being held already or being planned for. We've already had a Dyslexia Awareness Day, The WA Police Pipe Band perform for us, the Room 7 Assembly and the School Fun Run which was a fantastic event last Friday afternoon. ### Use of Playground Equipment

#### Bushfires

As we are coming into the bushfire season, we are reviewing and updating our practices regarding a bushfire emergency. In the coming weeks, we will be holding a Bushfire Emergency practice at the school to give students and teachers a chance to put in place our Bushfire Emergency processes. This will involve teachers responding to the emergency signal indicating a bushfire may impact on the school. The Emergency Signal can be one of the following:

(3 long Blasts of the Siren / Continuous Hooter / Continuous ringing of the handbell or 3 localised Whistle Blasts.

The preferred method will be 3 long blasts on the siren. The hooter, continuous ringing of the bell or whistle blasts will only be used if there is a power outage.

Students who have to relocate will be directed in an orderly manner under teacher supervision to the relevant safer location areas where they will await further instructions.

I'm sure your children will tell you about it when they get home after it has happened.

We have been notified this morning that 'Around the Corner Cafe' our lunch supplier has been sold. This Thursday 27 October will be the last day for lunch orders until other arrangements have been made.
