FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

We have a "No Sharing Food Policy" and are including the following information as a reminder to all parents and our wider school community. We have this policy as a number of our students are allergic to different foods and in a few cases the students are highly allergic to foods containing nuts.

Falls Road Primary is **not** a nut free school. Instead we educate staff and students on good hygiene habits; a "no sharing food" policy is in place in dealing with those with nut allergies. All staff are made aware of nut allergies and are trained in the use of an EpiPen. An EpiPen is carried with all duty teachers."

Our School Community supports students to develop the ability to "self manage" as they need to be able to do this for the rest of their life.

Though there is no requirement to do so, parents may choose to minimise foods which contain nuts such as peanut butter in student lunches.

We also regularly remind students to wash their hands when handling food. Reinforcing this at home will support us in promoting and developing good hygiene habits.

We thank you for your understanding with this.

Our NAPLAN testing for Year 3 and Year 5 and the testing of our Year 4 and Year 6 started yesterday. I would like to thank the teachers for their preparation and planning. They have been revising and providing practice opportunities for students to ensure they are familiar with the structure of the tests and are as comfortable as they can be.

Parents can help by ensuring that students get a good night's sleep and a nutritious breakfast. This will definitely support our students to do their best.

At the same time, our Year 4 and Year 6 students are doing their NAPLAN test from last year to monitor their progress and identify any areas which may require a continued focus. This is now an embedded strategy in our data collection and analysis cycle and it provides us with very useful information on the progress of these students.

Life Education Van

The Life Education Van will be visiting Falls Road in Week 5 this term. It will be located in the Staff car park just outside the Art Room. Each class from Kindergarten right through to Year 6 will visit the Life Education Van to participate in some 'hands-on' health activities relating to topics relevant to their year level.

Parents will be able to visit the Life Education Van on Wednesday, 25 May from 2.30pm – 3.00pm. They will be able to see what happens in the Life Education Van and look at some of the resources.

Walk safely to School Day

On Friday 20 May, Falls Road Primary will be participating in the national 'Walk Safely to School Day.' We are encouraging students and parents to walk, scoot or ride to school on this day to promote health and well-being and encourage some regular daily activity. All students who walk, scoot or ride will receive a sticker.

Faction Cross Country

The Faction Cross Country Carnival will be held on Friday 27 May. The first event will be held at 8.50am and the carnival should be finished by 10.30am. The first race will be the Year 4 boys and girls races, followed by the Year 3s, Year 2s, Year 1s and then the Year 5s and 6s. This year, the Year 2s will be participating in the Stirk Cross Country, so the first 5 boys and girls in the Year 2 races will be invited to the Stirk Cross Country.

There is an expectation that all students participate in the Cross Country even if they walk the course for their year level. Students not taking part should have a note explaining why they will not be participating. Only students who take part in the Faction Cross Country will be eligible for the Stirk Cross Country team, except under exceptional circumstances (eg. Illness or absent from school with reason).


