WASTE WISE SCHOOL

As a result of all this, our school is now an accredited Waste Wise School. Our accreditation sign and certificate will arrive in the school holidays and we will organise for this to be displayed in a prominent space, so keep a look out for it early next term.

As an accredited school we are now eligible for a grant. Miss Bunter will be using any funds gained through this process to embed and extend our Waste Free focus.

It is with great sadness and regret that the Baha'i SRE class has to close as from the end of this term.

We have been part of the school program for over 10 years, having had teachers over the years such as Agneta, Belinda, Paulette, Farah, Faye, Anne, Su and myself - Robin.

In previous years with Scripture and Baha'i being during class time we had approximately 50% of the school coming to Baha'i; but with the change to it being a lunch time club, and no change to teaching format of prayer, songs, story and activity/game – the numbers have dropped. At the beginning of the year we had up to 15, but we are having only 1-2 children turning up recently. We have found that the children are choosing, naturally, to spend their time outside in play.

This means that, considering the time for the teachers take to travel to your wonderful school, we have ruefully made the decision to cease the program.

We thank the School Board, the Principals and all the teachers (past and present) for the privilege of being able to spend time with such a lovely Community and hope that we may be able to re-commence our program at some time in the future.
