Dear Parents,

We have a "No Sharing Food Policy" and are including the following information as a reminder to all parents and our wider school community. We have this policy as a number of our students are allergic to different foods and in a few cases the students are highly allergic to foods containing nuts.

Falls Road Primary is **not** a nut free school. Instead we educate staff and students on good hygiene habits; and a "no sharing food" policy is in place in dealing with those with nut allergies. All staff are made aware of nut allergies and are trained in the use of an EpiPen. An EpiPen is carried with all duty teachers."

Our School Community supports students to develop the ability to "self manage" as they need to be able to do this for the rest of their life.

Though there is no requirement to do so, parents may choose to minimise foods which contain nuts such as peanut butter or nutella in student lunches.

We also regularly remind students to wash their hands when handling food.

Reinforcing this at home will support us in promoting and developing good hygiene habits.

We thank you for your understanding with this.


