Faction Cross Country

The Faction Cross Country Carnival will be held on Thursday, 31 May. The first event will be held at 8.50am and the carnival should be finished by 10.30am. The first race will be the Year 4 boys and girls races, followed by the Year 3s, Year 2s, Year 1s and then the Year 5s and Year 6s. The first 5 boys and girls in the Year 2 – Year 6 races will be invited to represent Falls Road PS at the Stirk Interschool Cross Country Carnival.

There is an expectation that all students participate in the Cross Country, even if they walk the course. All students who take part will earn points towards the Championship Shield as well as a point towards the Faction points competition for this term. Students not taking part should have a note explaining why they aren't participating. Only students who take part in the Faction Cross Country will be eligible for the Stirk Cross Country team, except under exceptional circumstances (e.g. illness, absent from school with reason). Students are able to practise for the Cross Country during 100s Club. An information sheet about the Cross Country has been sent home with this newsletter.
