Term 1 is quite short with 7 full weeks and 2 part weeks, however Term 2 is a lengthy 11 weeks. The main 'events' of Term 1 are NAPLAN (for Year 3s and 5s), and Swimming Carnivals (for Year 4s to 6s). So, we need to get down and busy straight away. Teachers will be inviting you to a short information session in the next few weeks, however if you wish to meet with them individually, do not hesitate to make an appointment.

Firstly, a small apology. I had committed to inform families of their class and teacher allocations on Monday, 29 January. Unfortunately, due to a few last moment departures, and excitedly several enrolments, we were unable to run our final processes until the next day. This year, we also implemented a system which allowed for greater privacy, whereby we simply informed you of your child's placement and their teacher and did not include the entire class list. This is becoming more common in schools, as we understand that often full lists of students are shared and out there in the public domain, which is not ideal. It all adds to the excitement of finding out who your classmates are when you rock up on the first day.

Heat

Murphy's Law would have it that the first days back at school are expected to be extreme heat conditions. Please ensure that every child has a brimmed hat (preferably school uniform) with name on it, a water bottle with name on it, and has applied sunscreen prior to coming to school. We will ensure that when children are in open areas they have hats on and that sunscreen is available to be reapplied during the day. Children are permitted to have their drink bottles in class and will be encouraged to fill these when needed. We will remind students to find shaded areas during recess and lunch. We will monitor activity during the breaks and ask students to take a rest if we feel that they are overexerting themselves in the heat.

There will be limited numbers able to access to the air-conditioned library, and all children will return to air-conditioned classrooms after breaks. The Physical Education program will be modified during excessive heat.

Dance

Year PP – 6 classes will participate in the modern dance program, throughout Term 1 on either Wednesdays or Thursdays. This means that Year 6s will not be undertaking dance during what is an extremely action filled Term 4. Consent2Go permissions have been forwarded home today.

Mobile Phones

In accordance with Department Policy, K-6 students are to hand their mobile phones in to the office at the commencement of the day and collect at the end of the day. These are individually secured. Exemptions only apply to students monitoring a health condition as part of a school approved documented health care plan. Smart watches must be set to aeroplane mode (or school setting) so that no phone calls or messages are sent or received during the day.; 'all communication between parents and students during school hours should be through the school's administration'.

Communication

You will receive communication from our school through telephone calls, email, including our newsletter, our website, or from teachers using applications such as see-saw. We invite you to make appointments to discuss concerns or celebrations with teachers, myself, or Simon Docherty (Deputy). When making an appointment please state the agenda so that we can be best prepared for a productive conversation. Meetings must focus upon solutions, with the child always being the priority.

School Development Days

The Department of Education has nominated that there will be six School Development Days in 2024. Three of these are standard across the State, (Jan 29 and 30 and December 13) three have been kept the same within our Bibbulmun Network of Schools (April 15, July 15, and October 7) This will provide consistency in our local area.

Bullying

Often the term bullying is misunderstood and used inaccurately. Included in this newsletter is a poster which is displayed around our school clearly outlining the correct application of the term 'bullying'. Our behaviour management policy and our approach clearly outline consequences for a range of misdemeanours and differentiates between being rude, mean (nasty) or bullying. Teachers will be speaking with their classes about these terms. Most situations which arise in our school are low to moderate level social conflict between students, generally of equal age, and is very easily resolved with restorative conversations. Or as the classic saying goes 'time heals all wounds'. We teach our students to be resilient, stand up for themselves, and for bystanders to intervene or inform an adult.

Year 6 2023 Gift

Our Year 6 students from 2023 gifted the school a bench seat which is very evident in our undercover area. We thank them, particularly Dads Adam Roulston, Glynn Kane and Russell Smith who constructed it. We are sure that our students will enjoy sitting on it during break times and whilst waiting for after school pick-up.

Scooters, Bicycles and Carparks

Children who are riding bicycles and scooters to school should be wearing helmets and walking them on and off school grounds. For their own safety, they must not ride through the carparks. Thanks to our P&C, we have a fantastic shade structure to store scooters and bicycles during the day.

I also remind parents that they are not to park in the staff car park, particularly before and after school.

Attendance and Punctuality

Please ensure that students are punctual to class. The school day commences at 8:40 am, however entry at 8:30am assists with students preparing themselves for the day, opportunities to interact informally with staff, and often, to undertake some revision activities. The earliest part of the day also focuses heavily on Literacy, and arriving late can mean that a student misses review of previous learning or introductory

explanations to new material. Late students are reminded to call past the front office to receive a late note to present to their teacher.

Attendance is also extremely important. In 2023 74% of our students were very good attenders however, the remaining 26% were of concern. Imagine a child attending 80% of their Primary School years, that by the time they head off to High School they will have completed almost 1 year's less schooling than many of their peers. Please think very carefully about time off and vacations during school term – these are not considered valid reasons for absence. We understand that illness cannot be avoided as this is a legitimate reason for absence. We ask that you inform the school via our front office, or the teacher directly, if your child will be or is absent. If a child is unwell for a notable period, we will support you in providing some form of home tuition. Schoolwork will not be provided for those travelling or on holiday.

Food Policy

We have a '**No Sharing Food Policy**' and have included the following information as a reminder to all parents and our wider school community. We have this policy as a number of our students are allergic to different foods and in a few cases, the students are highly allergic to foods containing nuts. Additionally, not touching and sharing food supports best practice with hygiene and health.

Falls Road Primary is **not** a nut free school. Instead we educate staff and students on good hygiene habits; a "no sharing food" policy is in place to support those with nut allergies. All staff are made aware of nut allergies and are trained in the use of an EpiPen. An EpiPen is carried with a duty teacher in each duty area"

*Our School Community supports students to develop the ability to "**self manage**" as they need to be able to do this for the rest of their life.*

Though there is no requirement to do so, parents may choose to minimise foods which contain nuts such as peanut butter in student lunches.

We also regularly remind students to wash their hands when handling food. Reinforcing this at home will support us in promoting and developing good hygiene habits.

We thank you for your understanding with this.

Finally

I reiterate my welcome to you all. I look forward to the first P&C meeting on Monday, 12 February. Best wishes and 'Happy New School Year' to you all.

Leaders' Assembly

The Semester 1 Leaders will host the first assembly of the year on Friday, 9 February (Friday, Week 2). The Leaders and Faction Captains will again be presented to the rest of the school and will also tell us a bit about what they do around the school. We will also be presenting the first merit certificates for the year. All parents are welcome to come along to this assembly.

100s Club

We will again be running our 100s Club in 2024 where students are supervised from 8.00am – 8.25am. All students should go to the oval if they arrive at school before 8.25am – Classrooms will open at 8.30am. This is a great way to start the day with some physical activity and catch up with friends while walking or running laps of the oval. A reminder that students **should not** be arriving prior to 8.00am.

Faction Shirts

Students will be given a faction point for **wearing their faction shirt on Fridays**. Students are also able to wear their faction shirt on carnival days or on their PE lesson day, **but faction points will only be given on a Friday**. The faction captains will count students in each class wearing their faction shirt on Friday and pass these numbers on to Mr Docherty. School Psychologist Service

School YouthCARE Chaplain Program

Participation in any chaplaincy program is voluntary for students. Students who are experiencing concerns in class, the playground, with friendships or any other general worries can access our school chaplain for an individual meeting. Consent forms for one-to-one appointments with the chaplain are available to students from the office. Students can fill out the form but will require a parent to give their signed permission. Signed forms can then be returned to the collection box in the office. All conversations with the school Chaplain are confidential, however, if she feels that further discussion with parents is required, she will refer this onto the Deputy.
