Important Reminders

Staff Car Park – The staff car park should not be used to pick up or drop off students unless you need to use the disabled car park. We remind parents and students to use the footpaths at the front of the school and not walk through the staff carpark.

100s Club – A reminder to all parents and students that if students (and parents) arrive at school between 8.00am - 8.25am, they MUST go down to the oval where supervision is provided. We ask that parents do not wait outside the classrooms or in other areas around the school during this time. Teachers are in their classrooms preparing for the day and the classroom doors will open at 8.30am.

Kindergarten / Pre-Primary Playground – At the end of the day, we ask that parents and students vacate the Kindergarten and Pre-Primary playground by 3.20pm. As always, the rules for using the playground equipment after school are the same as during regular school hours.

Use of Toilets after school – There have been a number of students that have been accessing the school toilets after 3.15pm. This is when our cleaners are cleaning the toilets and it can disrupt their cleaning schedule or in some cases require them to clean the toilets again. **We would ask that parents do not send their child / children to use the school toilets after 3.15pm.**

Crossing Roads – Please remind your child / children about crossing the road safely as we have recently had a number of reports of students crossing roads in an unsafe manner. Students crossing Burma Road should be doing so at the designated crossing point at the front of the school.
