Smart Devices

With increasing numbers of students coming to school wearing smart devices, I would ask parents to ensure that these are placed on school settings during the day and are not being used by students in the classroom or playground while at school. There is always someone in the office that can ensure any messages are passed on.

Reminders

Jewellery – Students should not wear dangling earrings to school. These are unnecessary and jewellery can be dangerous at times, particularly during play, Sport and Physical Education activities. Small studs and sleepers are acceptable. Children who wear religious medallions are requested to wear these under their T-shirts.

Winter Uniform - School uniforms are required to be worn at all times. The school logo is to appear on all hats, tops, jumpers and jackets. The jade polo top is the standard school t-shirt. Pre-primary to Year Six students are encouraged to wear their faction shirts on the days they have sport. Students can also wear leggings (full length only - under tartan skirt) and shorts / skorts. During colder weather, students may wear jackets over the top of their uniform before and after school and at '100s Club' but these must be taken off during the school day.

The P & C Uniform Shop has lots of good quality, second-hand jumpers, shirts, skorts and other school uniform items for sale at very affordable prices. Please ensure you re-name any second-hand items with your child's name.

Crosswalk – Students are reminded to cross Burma Road at the crosswalk, which is manned by our crosswalk attendant, Sam. Students must walk their bikes across the crossing and on the footpaths around the school.

Concerns or Issues – If parents have any concerns in regards to the school, please come and speak to us so that we can address the concern. If it is a student concern, the first point of contact should always be the classroom teacher.

Staff Car Park – The staff car park should not be used to pick up or drop off students unless using the disabled car park.

Toilets – We would ask that students do not use the toilets after 3.20pm as the cleaning staff are in the process of cleaning them at this time.
