



Falls Road Primary School 2023 - 2025 BUSINESS PLAN

An introduction to our plan

Falls Road Primary Independent Public School was first established in 1979 and officially opened in 1981. Our school motto is 'Challenge the Present – Create the Future'. Our school focuses on developing the 'whole child' through exposure to academic, artistic, social and sporting experiences that provide all students with the opportunity to 'shine' and enables them to participate as informed, active and responsible members of society.

In 2016, Falls Road Primary School was identified as one of the high gain schools across Australia that achieved substantially above expected National Assessment Program — Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) results for Year 3 and Year 5 students. We have maintained this consistent standard of high achievement and this was recognised in 2021 when we were awarded a Certificate of Academic Excellence from the Director General and the Minister of Education for our NAPLAN results. This is a reflection of the quality of the teachers and support staff at Falls Road, the effectiveness of the programs and strategies that we have implemented, the annual reflection and analysis of our school-based data and the continued commitment of time and resources that we invest in our students.

These programs and strategies include our early identification of students' needs and intervention through our Oral Language Speech Program; our Phonics focus underpinned by the Diana Rigg Synthetic Phonics Program which provides a solid foundation for students in learning to read; the development of English and Mathematics Scope and Sequence planning documents and whole-school approaches that ensure connectedness and continuity across the year levels; the implementation of the Quality Teaching Strategy; the development of a Falls Road Teaching and Learning Booklet to complement this strategy; our targeted Intensive Reading Program for Year 3 - Year 6 students, our small group support programs for students across the school; and our inschool Talented and Gifted Students (TAGS) initiatives.

Falls Road Primary Independent Public School has developed a team of teaching and non-teaching staff who are committed to achieving and maintaining these high standards of student achievement and identifying effective ways of adding value to programs already in place. We do this through a comprehensive yearly schedule of student assessment in Reading Comprehension, Maths, Spelling and Writing and tracking of student achievement from Pre Primary to Year 6. This is underpinned by a detailed analysis of our NAPLAN results which are conducted with all students in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 along with On-Entry testing for Pre Primary students.

To enhance our ability to know where our students are at and how we are doing, we contracted Best Performance to provide the Ed Companion data analysis software that enables us to carefully analyse both school and system data to ensure we are focusing our teaching at point of need. We continue to fine-tune this program with our range of school-based and system assessments which is enhancing our ability to monitor and analyse student progress. It has also assisted us in developing benchmarks which we use to determine the degree of student progress.

Analysis in 2019/2020 identified gaps in student achievement and research identified that schools using the Explicit Teaching approach were achieving significantly improved results in system-wide testing (NAPLAN) when this approach was implemented. Falls Road PS committed to a phased introduction of the Explicit Teaching approach throughout the school, which commenced in 2020 with the goal of improving student learning outcomes across all curriculum areas from K to Year 6. This will continue into 2023 with the implementation of the DoE Quality Teaching Strategy and the Falls Road PS Teaching and Learning Booklet which takes into account the context of our school.

The school is supported through a strong and active partnership with the Parents and Citizens Association and the School Board. Parents are regularly and positively engaged in a range of activities across the school. We have built a reputation as a responsive and engaging school where parents are seen as partners in the educational process and we work proactively to ensure this is maintained. This has been recognised and acknowledged in all previous IPS External Reviews of the school in 2013, 2016 and 2021.

Early intervention strategies are central to the philosophy of the school and are recognised as a cornerstone in developing and fostering life-long learning skills and habits. Our L3 Kindergarten Teacher has embedded a screening process from which targeted interventions are planned and delivered for identified students. The targeted interventions continue into Pre-Primary and Year 1 and Year 2 where required.

We have a range of proactive strategies in place to ensure regular attendance across all year levels and our attendance is consistently higher than the State average.




